## Dear Parents,

Welcome to Term 2! As
educators we are often asked
by families how they can build
independence in their child!
Let's have a look at how we
can do this together!

#### Step Back and Encourage Problem-solving:

- Let them work through challenges: Allow children to figure things out for themselves, even if it takes time or they make mistakes.
- Don't rush to help:Instead of immediately stepping in, watch them try different approaches to solve a problem.
- Focus on effort and persistence: Celebrate their attempts to solve problems and their perseverance, even if they don't succeed right away.

#### Offers Choices and Allow for Decision Making

- Encourage decision-making: Provide children with opportunities to make choices, even if it's just choosing between two options. This helps them develop a sense of autonomy and ownership.
- Give them control: Allow children to make choices about their clothes, their activities, or even what they want to eat
- Recognise their capabilities: Acknowledge that children are capable of making decisions and expressing their preferences.

## Supportive Environment

- Make things accessible: Ensure that children can access things they need to complete tasks independently, such as a stool for washing hands or a towel for drying themselves.
- Provide opportunities for play and exploration: Play is a natural way for children to develop independence and learn to solve problems,
- Encourage risk-taking: Allow children to take reasonable risks, as this helps them build confidence and resilience,

#### confidence and Independence

- Show them how you handle challenges: Children learn by observing the adults around them, so model confidence and resilience in your own behavior.
- Be positive and encouraging:
   Create a supportive environment where children feel comfortable trying new things and taking risks.
- Celebrate small successes: Acknowledge and praise their efforts, even when they don't achieve a perfect result.


#### Household Tasks

- Assign age-appropriate chores:
   Give children small tasks they can
   do independently, such as setting
   the table or putting their clothes
   away.
- Make it fun and engaging: Turn chores into games or activities that children can enjoy.
- Provide guidance and support: Help children learn the skills they need to complete their chores, and be patient with them as they learn.

 By implementing these strategies, parents can help their children develop a strong sense of independence, selfconfidence, and problem-solving skills, setting them up for success in the future

#### SCHOOL SAVINGS BONUS
