CURRICULUM

As you know, we have an update of goals and achievements every five weeks to show what students are learning and what they have learnt. To keep families even more up to date about their child/ren's we have now added another element of a continuum.

A Continuum of Learning is available for families to view through COMPASS. The continuum tracks the demonstration of skills and competencies for students in a completely evidence-based manner. The continuum is recorded against the student and will follow them from year to year. This also supports teachers to understand the knowledge the student already havr and where they can continue their learning.

Teachers can give students a score of partial, full and not yet attained competency.

PUPIL FREE DAY

Friday August 22nd will be a Pupil Free Day. Our staff will be focusing on Explicit Instruction, Assessment and Reporting as well as organising resources for the Teaching and Learning Program. Our Education Support Staff will be visiting supported learning schools to see how they are supporting the children. Our last Pupil Free Day for the year will be on November 3rd.

EVENTS

The students and staff have been busy with extra curricula activities. Grade 5/6 students went on a walking tour of the area surrounding the school, along the Werribee River to sites of local significance, as well as through the Werribee CBD itself to explore and take notes on nature, climate, observations of living things and architecture, and how these come together to support liveability in the area.

Grade 6 visited the Hoppers Crossing Youth Service Centre and see what they have to offer to support people aged 12-25.

Prep students visited Ecolinc and had the opportunity to: undertake a rubbish sorting activity, to show how recycling and reusing minimises the waste that is sent to landfill, participate in an interactive story that demonstrates the impacts of litter and pollution on the environment, search for and identify the invertebrates in a sample of compost, learn what scraps can be put into a worm farm.

The Grade 3/4 students explored the seasons, night and day and the Earth, Suns and Moons movement and phases inside a huge 'Cosmodome'. Some students said that, "we learnt about the Sun", "Space looks beautiful", "I want to learn more about the moon."

FACILITIES

John our facilities manager has been obtaining quotes for the fences. We are expecting the fences to be completed by the end of the year!! YAY!

We were also successful in gaining a grant to get some trees to put into our school. The side of the Gym has been cleared, and the plants have been planted there as well as along the oval fence line to create shade for the future years.

RISE AND SHINE 8:30'S THE TIME

Every Day and Every Minute Counts!

Families, please remember that every day counts—and so does every minute! To ensure students are ready for the day's learning, they should arrive at school by 8:30 am.

This week alone, we issued 150 late passes (not including those for medical appointments). Let's work together to bring that number down and set our students up for success from the very start of the day.



If your family is finding it challenging to get to school on time, please reach out to us. We're happy to meet and work together to create a plan that supports your child's attendance and learning.

This term we'll be placing a stronger focus on the minor behaviours that can disrupt learning—things like calling out, chatting during instructions, not following routines, or being off-task. While these behaviours might seem small, over time they can have a big impact on everyone's ability to learn and feel calm, focused, and respected in the

To support our students in making better choices, we'll be consistently using a clear four-step approach when these behaviours occur:

classroom.

- **Redirect** A quiet, non-verbal reminder (such as eye contact or a hand gesture) to help the student get back on track.
- **Respond** A clear, calm verbal reminder that explains the expected behaviour and what needs to change.
- **Restate** A second verbal reminder giving another opportunity to make a positive change.
- **Reflect** A final reminder involving a brief reflection opportunity (this might be a quiet moment at their desk or a short time away from the group).

If needed, further support or intervention may follow to help students build positive habits and take responsibility for their actions.

This approach is all about being fair, consistent, and respectful—and ensuring every child has the chance to do their best. By working together, we can help our students build great learning behaviours that will support them both now and into the future.

Along the way, we paused to chat about local wildlife, including the platypus and other animals that call the Werribee River home.




The day was packed with laughs,

PREP ECOLINC

EXCURSION 2025

On Monday 11th August the prep students visited Ecolinc in Maddingley to learn about the environment and explore some of the ways we can care for it. Students learnt about the importance of preventing waste from hurting the environment by learning strategies that can help to reduce the amount of waste









Students participated in various hands on tasks including sorting a huge pile of rubbish into the various bins, taking part in an interactive story about looking after our river system, cutting vegetables for the worm farm and watering the various plants using 'worm wee'.

TEACHER SKILLS

WHAT ARE THEY?

Teacher skills encompass a broad range of abilities that enable educators to effectively guide and support student learning.

These skills go beyond just subject matter knowledge and include interpersonal skills, classroom management, and adaptability. As a staff we have building our knowledge and practices around teacher skills.

This term we are focused on With-it-Ness, Proximity, Pause and Pace.

WITH-IT NESS

With-it-ness refers to a teacher's ability to be aware of what is happening in all parts of the classroom at all times and to respond quickly and appropriately to student behaviour.

PAUSE AND PACE

Pause and pace refer to how a teacher controls the speed and rhythm of instruction and communication during lessons to enhance student engagement, comprehension, and classroom management.

PROXIMITY

Proximity in teaching refers to how a teacher uses physical distance and movement within the classroom to manage behaviour, support learning, and build student relationships.


