- School calendar of events




COMPASS can be accessed via a web browser or on their APP which will send you push notifications.


THE NEWS FEED

The newsfeed is where communication items sent to the school community go. They are posted by staff members of the school.


Sometimes there will be information other times there will be attachments that can be viewed.



ATTENDANCE NOTE




It is important that we know when your child is not going to be at school.

Adding Attendance Note on Compass

- 1. Click Attendance Note
- 2. Choose reason from drop down box
- 3. Choose start date and end date
- 4. Add attachments if you have them (e.g. medical certificate)

If a child has been marked absent and has not arrived by 9:15 am an automatic text will be sent to key contacts highlighting the absence.



SEND AN EMAIL


If you need to make email contact with someone from school you can use the send email function on compass.


Automatically the classroom teacher and specialist teachers will be included.

DASHBOARD - CHRONCILE






Chronicle provides an overview of any attendance notifications or standing oviations that your child has recieved.




Attendance provides what attendance entries have been made, the type of absence and who entered the information.

At the end of each Semester (Term 2 and Term 4) students recieve an academic report.


This tells you how your child is tracking against the Victorian Curriculum.

CONTINUUM

As a school we use the continuum to track student learning against the Victorian Curriculum for each Curriculum Area.

What is the Continuum?

It outlines the expected learning journey for students, showing how their understanding and abilities develop over time. Think of it as a roadmap for learning, showing where students are now, where they are headed, and what steps are needed to get there.


It allows teachers to track a student's progress against these stages, noting which skills have been mastered, partially mastered, or not yet addressed.


By understanding where a student sits on the continuum, teachers can tailor their instruction to meet individual needs and help them progress.

The continuum allows us to report on a student's achievement and progress to families in real time, providing a clear picture of their learning journey.












Scroll Down, Press Open in Browser











If the continuum has been marked for that curriculum area Green and/or Orange will show.

Green means all components of that curriculum progressions have been achieved.

Orange means the student has some areas still to work on.

Grey/Black means no data has been enterted.

Click the arrow for one of the coloured areas.

Tick - means your child has achieved that statement Arrow - means your child is working on that statement Cross - means your child has not achieved or been taught that statement yet.
